## Introduction for the Common Application for Undergraduate College Admission Listening Activity

Which of the prompts could Noe respond to if he were writing his Personal Essay for the

It can be an intellectual challenge, a research query, an ethical dilemma - anything that is of personal importance, no matter the scale. Explain its significance to you and what steps you took or could be taken to identify a solution. Discuss an accomplishment or event, formal or informal, that marked your transition from childhood to adulthood within your culture, community, or family. What evidence or details from Noe's story could be used to respond to one of the above prompts? Summarize below.
